The Insurance Bureau of Canada outlines the following steps to make an insurance claim.

- 1. Report the loss to the police.
- 2. Obtain a case number from the police.
- 3. Prepare a complete list of the damaged or stolen items.
- 4. Indicate when and where the items were purchased.
- 5. List the values of all items (preferably replacement value, but it is acceptable to give the original cost if it was a very recent purchase).
- 6. Complete the form sent by the insurance company. Have it notarized (by a notary public or lawyer) and return it to the insurance company.
- 7. Remember that serial numbers and bills of sale are of great help to insurance investigators and companies.
- 8. If home or property is damaged, the victim should include photos of damage with the claim.
